Dear Friends,


Some months my Pastoral Letter almost writes itself; somtimes it's harder. This month is one of those harder months so there's a few random thoughts this time rather than one longer piece.

First of all, the similarities between Lord Kitchener and our Superintendent. No, he's not been growing a verdant moustache, or as far as I know taken to wearing a peaked cap; but in a lot of ways he's been echoing Kitchener's sentiments - "Your Circuit needs YOU!" There are a number of opportunities to serve the circuit at the moment, including Circuit Steward, Mission Area Advocate, or helping with the many other jobs that help keep things running and working for God in this area. If you'd like to know more, just ask!

In some ways running contrary to that was a course I went on last week about Time Management, with a subtitle of "Learning how to say no!" Part of that was about better organisation - but part of it was also about priorities. It's making me think about what my priorities are - and what they maybe should be. Whether this will include doing my Pastoral Letter earlier we'll have to see, but it does make me think - if we were each to pick one or two things that we think God wants to be our priorities, what would they be and are we being true to them? Finally, with Holy Week fast approaching, I always find that Maundy Thursday and Good Friday some of the most challenging but also most rewarding parts of the Christian story. It's hard to hear the accounts of Christ's betrayal, and Christ's passion; they take us out of our comfort zone, and challenge us to confront things about ourselves that we'd sometimes rather not think about. At the same time, I increasingly understand how vital they are in the Easter Story - with them, the power and the glory of Christ are magnified even further when we realise that Christ's victory over death and sin is all the more complete because it includes our betrayals, our sins, our death. I know not everyone can make the services in Holy Week - but do please at least read the accounts in the Gospel if you can. I find it makes Easter Sunday all the more joyful!

Pray for wisdom for those seeking to resolve these conflicts


Ask God to encourage and strengthen Christians who are being persecuted for their faith in Jesus Christ
