From Churches Together

On **Thursday 2nd November from 5-6 pm** Shropshire Friends of Palestine are holding **a silent candlelit vigil** in the Square in Shrewsbury to mark the centenary of the Balfour Declaration i.e. the letter written by foreign secretary Arthur Balfour to Lord Walter Rothschild in 1917.

In it he declares his hope for a national home for the Jewish people in Palestine ..."it being clearly understood that nothing should be done which may prejudice the civil and religious rights of existing non-Jewish communities in Palestine...." Unfortunately for the Palestinian people, this has not been the case. These people include the ever smaller remnant of Palestinian Christians in the West Bank and Gaza, as well as Arab Christians experiencing discrimination in Israel.

We have also made a donation of £250 to St John's, as our contribution towards the cost of heating/lighting etc.

Dorothy Charlesworth has very kindly agreed to do a craft activity with the older children – we are looking forward to her coming and are excited about what we will be making! It would be lovely if we could have a monthly craft activity at Toddler Group, led by members of St John's. Given the age of our children, it need only be a very simple activity, such as decorating biscuits with smiley faces etc. If you are at all talented in this area, please consider offering that talent to Toddler Group. It would be very much appreciated!

As well as the pleasure of the craft activity, it would be a super way for our mums/grandmas to get to know some members of St John's and to know that the church is interested in them. Positive responses by St John's members to posts on the Toddler Group facebook page could naturally follow on, building another bridge between Toddler Group and St John's.

Something to Think About

I recently read the autobiography of Canon Andrew White, known as the Vicar of Baghdad. The book is called 'My Journey So Far' and I borrowed it from Whitchurch Library. It is a very thoughtprovoking as well as inspiring read.

In the epilogue, Andrew described a visit he made to the US, travelling to various places and meeting church leaders who support his work in Iraq and the Middle East. As Andrew was being shown round a Christian school, a little boy called Sean went up to him and gave him \$1 for the 'children in Iraq'. Andrew was very moved by this act, which reminded him of the story of the widow's mite.

At the next school he visited, Andrew told the story of Sean's dollar and said that he saw it as a sign of God's goodness and provision and that God could use anyone – even a little boy – to meet people's needs. As Andrew told the story, students began to get up and go to him, each one offering \$1 or more.

For the remainder of the visit, wherever Andrew went he told this story and the response was always the same. By the end of the visit, Sean's dollar had become \$25,000!

This story of Sean's dollar reminded me of the story of the feeding of the five thousand, where a small boy gave what he had to Jesus, and Jesus was able to use it to do immeasurably more than anyone could ask or imagine!

Whatever we offer to God in faith – be it money, prayer, time, talent, our testimony – we need never be ashamed or embarrassed by its 'smallness'. God can take our small offering and use it to fulfil his great purposes!
