Message from the Manse



Dear Friends,

What are you doing on your Sabbatical?" It's a question that a few people have asked me, so maybe it's time to talk a bit about what a Sabbatical is for, and what I intend to do with May, June and July.

The Methodist Church decrees that every seventh year, a Minister should have a Sabbatical - the first one coming in what has historically been your tenth year (as it is for me), although that's now changing a little. It's not a three month holiday, but it is about what you might call "R&R" - an opportunity to be released from your everyday ministry to do something different for a spell, to be away from the regular work that you do, and hopefully to do something that will resource and refresh you. Hopefully, the returning Minister will re-enter regular work with new energy and new ideas.

This means I will be taking a break from preaching, pastoral work, chairing meetings, and all the other things that make up my typical week. It's recommended that you worship elsewhere, and as a family we are likely to do just that; I won't be leading funerals (Rev. Jenny Arthurs has agreed to be the first point of contact for that) and cover for urgent pastoral issues is being arranged in the Circuit - more details will hopefully be coming soon. That doesn't mean you have to ignore me if you see me out and about - but it does mean I'm supposed to avoid "talking shop" with you!

Instead, I will be spending some time on retreat - a week near the beginning, and a week near the end; and doing a project relating to Cinema and Theology - watching films, reflecting on what they say to us in the Church and what the Church may say to them, and looking at some of the academic work that already exists in this area - Gladstone's Library, up in Hawarden, has a good collection, and I will be expected to produce a short paper for the District. And then, maybe in the Autumn, we might look at doing something like "Movies with a Message" - a Film Club at St. Johns! There are other things I plan to do as well: learning to play my Ukulele is something I've been threatening to do for a long time for example - but hopefully, when I do return, there will be new ideas, new energy, and new reflections on God's Grace for me to share with you.

Fundraising, Outreach or Both?

Like many people, I feel awkward when talking about fundraising for our church buildings. With so much suffering around the world, are we justified raising money for our church in Whitchurch? Are we prioritising money over mission?

At the recent Circuit Meeting on 13th March, it was clear that the Circuit Team view fundraising for church refurbishment projects as an essential part of resourcing mission, enabling us to reach out to local communities and encourage them to come and share our space. The point was made that if we don't have the energy and enthusiasm to raise money for our vision of improved facilities, how will we find the energy and enthusiasm to respond to the opportunities for outreach that arise?

The Circuit believes in our church vision to make St John's accessible to all and have identified us as a growing church. They have demonstrated their support by giving us a grant and lending us money to cover the final cost of the project. Now the first phase of building work is nearing completion and we need to repay the loan while taking the next steps to fulfil our mission to share God's love with more people in Whitchurch.

We are putting together a programme of events over the next 12 months to raise funds to pay off the circuit loan and to encourage the local community to come into our church. These include the **concert on 18th May**, a jumble/ nearly new sale in June (please start collecting items!) and an Art Show in August. Ideally, we will hold at least one event each month so if you would like to organise a fundraising event eg quiz, plant sale or open garden please let me know and we can include it in the plan.

Many thanks in advance for your support. This is an exciting time for St John's. Please pray that, with God's help, we will make the most of this opportunity.

ACCESS NEWS

We are now well over half way through our Access Project and beginning to look towards the end. As I write this on 26thMarch we are only thirteen building days away from completion date (12th April). It's going to be a very tight squeeze! The Contractor will be very keen to finish by this date!

The gardens are really beginning to take shape. Things look very different with the paths awaiting the tarmac and the lawns beginning to take shape. Once the special slabs are in place on the steps, the tarmac will go down to put the finishing touches to the front of the church. The lawns now have an interesting ebb and flow to them as they have been shaped to accommodate the different levels. The lawns will be seeded – just the right time of year, but the gardener will find them interesting to cut!

The lighting bollards are in place and they will be operated on a time switch. Our church will look very different from the outside, especially at night. The approach to the Long Room will change. Two retaining brick walls are taking shape as the different levels to the car park are dealt with. The door into the Long Room will be adjusted so we won't be able to use that entrance for a while.

The work inside the church is progressing well although there is still a lot to do. The new door linking the two parts of the building has been formed with the mason has used the original stone to finish the job off. Once the plasterer and the joiner have done their work it will look as though the door has always been there!

We still have major issues with our heating system; the pipes are very old, many of the joints are corroded, so we will have to make big decisions about what to do. Some of these problems are part of our Phase II refurbishment, but it makes sense to address them now whilst we are dealing with the heating.

I would like to thank all church members for their patience and understanding during this difficult time. We all hate all the disruption the work is causing, but we are nearly there! Soon the plastic will be off and we will have our organ back; the church is dirty and will need a thorough clean when the builders have finished – and, incidentally, many thanks to Michael Mulliner for providing the floor coverings in the church.

Lastly, please can I invite you all to our free Celebration Concert on May 18th? The Farndon Brass Band as well as the Whitchurch Community Choir will be here to entertain us. We will be able to use our new door for the first time! The concert starts at 7.30pm and donations are welcome. The next time I write in the Newsletter, all the work will be finished, and we will have our church back to ourselves again! Hooray!

Pray for all those affected by recent natural disasters – especially the people of Mozambique – and ask that aid agencies will be able to offer appropriate help both now and in the longer term.

Pray for all those affected by the attack on the mosque in New Zealand. Ask God to comfort the bereaved and injured and that local Christians will play a significant part in bringing healing and reconciliation.

Pray for Christians who are being persecuted for their faith in Jesus Christ, thinking especially of Christians in Nigeria, where 690 Christians, mainly women and children, have been killed by Islamic militants since the beginning of 2019, an event that has gone largely unreported in the Western media. Pray that God's love and comfort will strengthen these Christians and that His Presence will be very close to them.
