In England and Wales:

- 9% of adults experienced psychological abuse during child-hood.
- 7% suffered physical abuse in childhood
- 7% suffered sexual assault in childhood
- 8% witnessed domestic violence or abuse in the home during childhood

More than one in ten women and 3% of men in England & Wales were sexually assaulted during childhood. Traumatic life experiences can have a significant impact on people's lives, increasing the risk of poorer physical and mental health and poorer social, educational and criminal justice outcomes. have visited St. Alkmund's and The Beacon as we prayerfully consider the worship offer at St. John's relative to the other churches in the town, and develop a vision for the future.


