Dear Friends

Methodist Conference is coming to Telford in 2020, and it's fair to say that it will be an occasion that is keenly anticipated.

One of the big topics that came out of Conference 2019 was a report called "God in Love Unites Us", and the subsequent discussion and recommendations about it- which were in general supported strongly at Conference. While the report covers a number of areas in the field of human relationships – such as divorce, and co-habitation (i.e. living together without being married), the issue that captured most attention was to do with same-sex marriage. Essentially, what the report tries to do is find a way for those who believe very different things about these areas to still be in fellowship together.

This includes promises that no Church and no Minister will be forced to conduct same sex marriages – it will be optin, not opt-out; and before any of this can be implemented, the Conference of 2020 will have to confirm the decision after discussions at the District Synods in Spring 2020.

Our District is running a number of events (see the fullpage article further on in this Newsletter for details) where people can come and express their views and find out more. There are plenty of resources available expressing a range of different views – from Methodist Evangelicals Together, who strongly oppose the recommendations, to Dignity and Worth, who strongly support them. The Report itself is available from the Methodist Church Website, and I can provide copies to anyone who wants them. They are particularly asking people to look at the report itself – if there is interest, I am prepared to offer some Study Sessions based on the pack they have provided to every Minister.

If anyone wishes to offer lifts to any of these events, or would like a lift to any of them, please contact me; this is your opportunity to express your views to the District ahead of Synod, and I know that there will be plenty of voices that will want – and need – to be heard.

What Happened to 2019? A personal view.

I'm sure, that, like me, many of us, start to reflect on the year just gone at this time of the year. How was 2019 for you? Was it happy? Was it successful? Was it productive?

On reflecting on 2019, my life broke down into two distinct parts. The two parts were the Access for All Project at church, and secondly, my personal health. I apologise if this all sounds very boring. If so, fast forward to the next article!

For me, the Access project started on 7th January 2019. My task was to liaise with the builders, the architect and our Church Council here at St John's. I really enjoyed getting to know the architect, the Site Manager and all the individual workers. They were a grand bunch of people. It was most interesting watching the work develop. It was difficult watching our lawns become swallowed up in mud as new drains were put in – I could not visualise how anything good could come out it at all – I couldn't even understand the plans! However, the workmen eventually moved inside. The organ was enveloped in protective plastic, the floors were extended and the fireplace from the Guild Room was laid to rest under the floorboards of the new floor. For me, the most exciting (and complicated) part was the building of the new door joining the Guild Room to the church. I watched in awe as the stone mason chipped away at the new door, brick by brick, stone by stone. I was privileged to be present when the final breakthrough was made as I shook hands with Matt from the other side. Gradually the work was finished off. I remember being shocked when I saw the colour of the new doors for the first time along with the lovely new interior doors!

Saturday June 29th was a lovely warm sunny day. It was good to welcome our previous minister Revd. Michael Parrott back to St John's to perform the opening ceremony. I was very grateful to everyone who made the event possible – and especially to Reg Hall who did the honours with the scissors. Looking back, in my opinion the Access Project was good for St John's Methodist Church in Whitchurch; it is brighter and much easier to get in and out of (no coincidence that Whitchurch Community Choir have decided to use our premises for their rehearsals in the future.) Our church has become a beacon at night – it really stands out, don't you think?

The second part of my 2019 I mentioned at the start of this article was my health. I regret that I am no longer as involved in church life as I once was. During 2019 I had three operations! Is this a record? I had a thyroid operation in March, my pacemaker fitted in May and lastly, my hip replaced in July. The National Health Service has been wonderful to me – I reckon I have had my money's worth!

And what of the future? Sheila's sister, Sandra, who many of you know, is moving to Norfolk in the new year. Sheila & Sandra are virtually inseparable, so 2020 could be a very big year for us! Who knows where we will be this time next year? We shall see!

PRAYERS OF THANKSGIVING AND INTERCESSION

As we reflect on the Christmas story in the coming weeks, let us ask God to give us fresh insight and new revelation so that the familiar story excites us again and energises our faith.

As we meditate on Mary's response to God's call on her life, let us pray that we, too, may respond in faith to what God is asking of us at this time. Give thanks for the amazing truth that God longs for us to work with Him to fulfil His purposes in our church, in our town and in our nation.

As the Wise Men travelled together on a journey of discovery, let us give thanks for the people of St John's, with whom we make our faith journey. Give thanks for all that we share together: friendship, fellowship, meals and social occasions, and especially our life together in Jesus Christ. Pray that together we may experience understanding, acceptance and friendship on our journey of discovery to that special Friend who is coming again this year.

Each of the Wise Men brought a different gift to the Christ Child. Ask God to reveal to you your unique gift and pray for the faith and courage to use that gift to His praise and glory. Remember that God made each one of us different. Nobody else in the whole of human history has the same personality and situation that you have. Your call is to use your particular gift in your particular life-setting.

Let us give thanks for those who will be visiting St John's this Christmas time – especially for the Christmas Tree Festival, Carol service and the Toddler Group nativity – and let us pray that they will not only receive a warm welcome, but will sense the presence of God in our midst as we offer Him our praise and thanksgiving.

During the busyness of our Christmas preparations let us pause and consider those for whom Christmas is not a time of joyful anticipation. For some people, maybe people known personally to us, Christmas will be a sad and lonely



time. Ask the God of all comfort to meet with them and give to them according to their individual need. Ask God if He wants us to be part of the answer to our prayer. We continue to pray for our nation - especially for the general election and ask that God, in His mercy, will raise up men and women of integrity and honesty to be our political leaders.

We continue to pray for the wider world: Pray for those parts of our world where there is conflict – pray for wisdom for those seeking to resolve the conflicts peacefully. Ask God, the God of all comfort, to comfort those people, especially children, who are being traumatised by conflict and war.

Ask God to encourage and strengthen Christians who are being persecuted for their faith in Jesus Christ. Pray especially for Christians in China who are facing severe restrictions on worship and Bible study.

Pray for refugees – that they may find safe havens to live, with shelter, food, water, education and healthcare for their children.


Pray for those who have lost their homes and livelihoods during the recent natural disasters. Ask that they may receive the help that they need to rebuild their lives.
